“Bank Money” is optional for day campers. Any money not spent will be returned to your child on Friday. Bank money can only be used on the assigned shopping day. (Girls will shop on Wed. Boys will shop on Thursday.) Instead of putting money in the bank, you can send money in an envelope marked “STORE” on that day.

* If you are NOT able to keep this reservation, **PLEASE** notify us as soon as possible so we can offer it to a child on the waiting list.

Parent/Guardian “To Do” List:

1. Read ALL of the confirmation material carefully.
2. Complete the Medical Form & have your signature notarized.
3. Fill out the Camper Release.
4. **EXPRESS CHECK-IN:** We must receive the Medical Form already notarized, the Camper Release and final payment **at least one week before** your week of camp. (Bank money can be sent, too, as it will NOT be accepted at check-in.)
5. If necessary, you may bring all of the above mentioned items with you to participate in the regular registration line.

General Information:

- **Regular Day Camp Hours are 9:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.** Please do not arrive early! The gate will be locked until 8:45 a.m.
- **Monday registration is from 8:30 - 9:00 a.m.** Please do not arrive early! The gate will be locked until 8:15a.m. Your children are very important to us and we want their arrival to be a pleasant and positive experience, so **please allow time** for making a smooth transition into camp!
- The camp fee covers lunch, snacks, crafts, activities, a camp t-shirt and a keepsake DVD of the week of camp.
- Acceptance & participation in camp are the same for everyone regardless of race, color or national origin.
- Special arrangements can be made with the camp nurse if medication must be given during day camp hours.
- Campers are allowed to keep asthma inhalers with them upon approval from the camp nurse.
- We reserve the right to send anyone home (without a refund) for unacceptable behavior or for bringing unacceptable items. See the “Do Not Bring” list on the following page.
- Phone calls to & from home are ONLY allowed in the case of an emergency.
- ALL visitors must check in with the Camp Director IMMEDIATELY upon arrival.
- **Campers will be assigned to a cabin for resting and changing for swimming.**

What to Bring: (in a bag or backpack)

- modest one-piece swimsuit (A dark cover-up must be worn over two-piece suits.)
- towel & flip flops for swim time
- sunscreen -- if you want a staff member to re-apply
- an extra outfit. . . just-in-case

Label your things with your name or initials.

Snack Shack/ Camp Store:

Daily snacks are included in the camp fee.

Snack Shack gift bags are **ONLY** offered during overnight camp.

The camp store will be open for parents at 4:30 Monday - Friday.

What to Wear:

About Transportation:

If you requested transportation help on the registration form, we will contact you **at least one week prior** to the week of camp to confirm the details.

Lumberton Walmart (Exit 22)

- There is **NO** Monday morning pick up.
- Tuesday - Friday pick up is between 8:00-8:15 a.m. The bus will pull out at 8:15 a.m.
- Monday - Thursday drop off is between 4:45-5:00 p.m.
- In the afternoon, a staff member will wait with your child. If you do not arrive by 5:00 p.m., your child will be returned to Camp Grace to wait for you there.
- There is **NO** Friday afternoon drop off. There is a closing program from 4:00 - 4:45.

Lumberton McDonald's (Exit 17)

- There is **NO** Monday morning pick-up.
- Tuesday - Friday pick-up is between 8:15-8:30 a.m. The bus will pull out at 8:30 a.m.
- Monday - Thursday drop-off is between 4:30-4:45 p.m.
- For your convenience, a staff member will arrive in the morning around 8:00 a.m. to wait with your child. In the afternoon, a staff member will wait with your child. If you do not arrive by 5:00 p.m., your child will be returned to Camp Grace to wait for you there.
- There is **NO** Friday afternoon drop off. There is a closing program from 4:00 - 4:45.

DIRECTIONS: Take I-95 to Exit 7 (Raynham Rd.) turn East toward McDonald & Fairmont. Stay on Raynham Road for 4.5 miles. Turn Right onto Grace Drive. Follow signs into the "heart" of camp.
